Interview with Dave Atallah, our new Vicar!

Where were you before you came to White Waltham? I served my curacy for 4 years in Devon, in Okehampton and villages around. Before that I was the Youth and Children's Minister for a church in Exeter, and before that I was studying for a PhD in medical physics.

What particularly attracted you to WW? Having worked on the staff of a big city church, and then in smaller local places, this was an opportunity to be supported by the resources of St Marys Maidenhead, where I am still honorary staff, and get stuck into local community church and outreach.

What made you decide to become a Vicar in the first place? I had a 'niggle' for a few years, about being a full-time Christian worker in some way, whilst I pursued being a hospital physicist. In the end we decided to test it to see what God's will was for us, and here we are...

What do you enjoy most about being Vicar? I love teaching and telling stories, in church or school or wherever. I enjoy the huge variety that a week can bring. And knowing we have the best news in the world to share about Jesus and God's love is always encouraging.

What are your priorities for your work in this Parish? I want to find out what God is already doing, what the church is enjoying and doing well. Having a background in children's work and children of my own, families will be a priority and maybe also men - look out for men's breakfasts!

What do you want WW church to look like in 5 years' time? Same as now, but more! Through trusting in Jesus, boldly sharing a message of hope, being a community of love, and rejoicing in the presence of our Father God.

What is your favourite Bible passage and why? This varies depending on what I am going through and what I am preaching on because God's word is living and active and He always speaks to us into our situation. We recently looked at Acts 2v42 and the verses that follow and I have been using that to ask people how they think we are doing at learning from God's Word, loving each other and worshipping God.

Favourite hymn/song? I am enjoying 'Before the throne of God above' which speaks of the absolute amazing confidence we can have about God and eternity through Jesus Christ and what he has achieved for us.

What are the biggest issues that face the church in the 21st century? Amongst them have to be over-busyness, apathy, and the prevailing cultural teaching that there is no absolute truth, and everything is relative. These all come from pride, selfishness, and a huge loss of the sense of living in God's world as God's creations.

How do you achieve a good work/life balance? Need to book 'fun' in or it disappears in a busy diary. Having a beautiful wife that you want to spend time with helps, as does the craziness of my 3 children!

What would your ideal day off look like? We have some regular things we enjoy, but I love a one-off challenge like a mud-run (done) or a parachute jump (not yet).

What do you do to wind down? I play sport, or I get grumpy, mostly racket sports at the moment. I belong to a badminton club, the squash league at the Magnet and am looking forward to tracking down the White Waltham tennis court! But dads' 5-a-side anyone? Also reading, going to theatre or watching films, and I play sax.

Favourite food? It varies – definitely includes fried breakfast, and anything with chocolate

Favourite drink? Partial to cider or wine, or fresh cold mango juice

What are your personal ambitions? Not sure... write a children's allegorical adventure book(?) exploring ideas of God, creation and rescue, set in space!

Tales from the Bells

 *White Waltham Bell Ringing*



Since our last Tales from the Bells we have had a broken stay at Shottesbrooke. The stay was repaired within five days of it being broken. It is not a nice experience when a stay breaks whilst you are ringing. But this is a safety device and saves serious damage to the bell and the rest of its fittings.

We have had visitors at both churches recently: a group from Whiting Society of Ringers and also The Somerset Ringer and Friends Group.

At the Hurst Show the Sonning Branch of Bell ringers had a mini ring to demonstrate the art of bell ringing and to let members of the public have a try on The Charmborough Ring which is a portable ring of mini bells. The heaviest bell is $\frac{3}{4}$ cwt and it is the heaviest portable ring in existence. Those who wanted to pursue their interest in finding out a bit more about ringing were offered taster sessions at a tower in the Sonning Branch.

There are times when even to an experienced ringer things do not always appear the way we would expect them. On a recent tower visit a couple went to visit a tower, not to ring there, but to enjoy the view. On the way up they passed the bells and were really surprised and taken aback to see the 'Stay' which is the part of the bell, was not a conventional solid ash stay but appeared to be just a branch and was held in by a nail! This ring of bells was also one of a few rings of bells which had Patent Redenhall clappers which allows the ball of the clapper to slide down the stem of the clapper once it has struck the bell thereby making it sound for longer.

We hope that you all have a refreshing holiday wherever you are going this summer.

We have had a blazing Summer Term, one of the warmest on record! It has been a very busy term with a whole lot of activities that the children have participated in and enjoyed. Parents also came into school for various events including 'Work Viewing' afternoon and 'Dads in School' day. Dads, grandads, brothers, uncles etc had a fantastic time taking part in the many activities with their children for dads in school day. Some of their comments were "It was so good to see all the children talk about their dads in such an affectionate way. Even the 'dad jokes' were good!" "It was wonderful to see the children having fun and showing their affection in different ways for the men in their lives. What is a children's centre?

A children's centre is a place where local families with children under 8 years old can enjoy activities, receive support and advice in many different ways from trained professionals.

Activities are designed for parents; expecting a baby or for those with children under 8 years old encouraging social interaction, development and learning through play and supporting transition to school. Some support can be offered in the home.

Children's centres can also help families with managing finances and getting back into work. One of the ways we can help people get into work is through our volunteering programme. A volunteer is someone who gives their time and commitment free of charge to help out at their local children's centre. Volunteers are an important and valued part of children's centre, as they help us to deliver services and to reach out to families in the local community.

We have a variety of voluntary roles available across all the children's centres. Volunteers are currently involved in:

- helping with stay and play sessions
- preparing snacks and washing up
- registering families
- gardening
- reception duties
- meet and greet families
- signposting families to groups and other services.

Free training is offered to all our volunteers, including food hygiene, safeguarding, and paediatric first aid. All volunteers will be subject to an enhanced DBS check and references will be obtained.

Volunteers along with children's centres also work closely with other services including health visiting, libraries and youth services.

Am I too late?

My computer gave out on me this week and so I just might be too late to send this article in. At least my laptop is still working!

So, I thought, what about lateness? Let me be totally true to my Christian beliefs and what the Bible has to say. Across the western world, which certainly includes England and New Zealand, belief in the Bible has become a minority view and this is the work of Satan, gods, and the Christian's adversary. If he can persuade people that the Bible is nothing but an out-of-date book of stories he is on to a winning road.



But if we look at the facts honestly, we would have to admit that the Bible stands unchanged (unlike science which changes its mind from month to month and we only have to look at evolution to see how true that is). Modern research and archaeology simply add to the reliability of God's word and never has the Bible been shown to be in error.

Thus we ought to get to know what God has to say to us and to take it very seriously.

So let us see just a few things that God says to us. (Genesis 1:1) In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Oh yes, I realise that lots of you will say "But hasn't science proved that . . ." Let me remind you that science still cannot explain the origin of life and has never produced any fossils that are half way from one species to another. Let's be clear, evolution means one species transforming into another species and there is absolutely no evidence of such a transition. In reality what evolutionists tell us are theories . . . which are regularly modified to take into account the latest scientific discovery. I should also tell you that despite real scientific evidence, they have stated over and over again that they could never admit the possibility of a divine being (the Bible calls Him God of course) being responsible for creation.

So they deny God's existence and in effect, declare themselves to be gods and thus they can make up their own rules particularly about right and wrong.

The Bible also talks a very great deal about heaven . . . and hell. On the basis of God's word, I know that my place in heaven is secure – is yours? I also know that many people I have known and loved here on earth will also be in heaven. Sadly, I also know that many will not be there because they have gone to their deaths denying God's salvation and His free offer of eternal life. They left it too late.

Please, please don't be among those folk, take the time to decide today to trust in what God offers through His Son and His death for our sins on Calvary.

In one of Paul's sermons he said: 'Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved.'

In particular, the following items are not allowed: any lighting, whether electric or otherwise; any glass shades; kerbs, fencing, railings or other demarcation; stone or glass chippings; individual gardens, including the planting of shrubs; plastic flowers and wreaths (other than poppies of remembrance); toys or other objects which are not part of a properly authorised memorial.

We have displayed notices asking people to help us to adhere to these new regulations by removing these items. Any items which are not removed from the Cremation Area will be carefully stored and can be collected by arrangement with Tony Hill on Tel. 01628 822654 or via email at hillhomewood@btinternet.com until 31 May 2019. After that time any remaining items will be disposed of.

As reported in an earlier issue the Hurley and the Walthams Neighbourhood Plan was adopted by the council in December 2017.

In our Neighbourhood Plan land at Breadcroft Lane is listed as Local Green Space Designation. The justification given: 'A natural and historical boundary between the two parishes of White Waltham and Cox Green. The individual communities benefit from this natural green space that protects the biodiversity of the area. It is also listed as Countryside Open Space in the CROW Act 2000.

However in the submitted Borough Local Plan this land is listed in the Housing Site Allocation Proforma. Your Neighbourhood Plan Chairman, Cllr Maureen Hunt responded to Regulation 18 and Regulation 19 commenting that this did not comply with our adopted Neighbourhood Plan, or with policy IF4 in the Borough Local Plan (Open Space) and is Green Belt. Mention was also made of the added vehicle movements on the already very busy Cannon Lane.

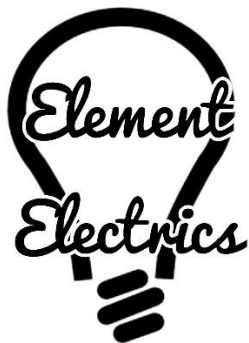
At the recent Hearing for the Borough Local Plan your Parish Councillor and a member of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group spoke in support of keeping the land as Local Green Space. There will be more representations made in September and we await to hear if we are called to speak.

This may seem a little complicated (and without having some knowledge of the Neighbourhood Plan, the submitted Borough Local Plan and what Regulation 18 and 19 mean – it is) but we are working diligently for our Parishes.

Investment set to improve road network

The council is investing on our roads spending more than £7.7million over the next year. Being a councillor we always take note of our roads but with the largest Ward in the Borough and with some tucked away lanes, it is difficult to get around the whole area so please do help us to help you.

£2.7 million is for annual works programme including resurfacing and an extra £240,000 to repair winter damage. The rest of the funding will be used to maintain and improve the highway network including bridge maintenance, cycle schemes, verge protection, road markings and more. This investment will restore infrastructure and prevent the need for more expensive works in the future. It will also create new features including crossings and widened carriageways and launch schemes to boost safety and make cycling easier.

Fundraising appeal for Maidenhead Charity Re:Charge R&R

Re:Charge R&R is a Maidenhead-based charity whose focus is to support local vulnerable children, families and individuals through weekly drop-in sessions.

These sessions aim to offer a safe, friendly environment for local families, and to provide advice and support to enable them to overcome challenging, difficult and sensitive situations. Users are signposted to relevant agencies already established within the Borough, when necessary.

Additionally, a new service has just been launched, called “Freedom Café”, to support individuals recovering from addictions.

Freedom Café assists with addiction recovery without the need for an official referral, runs the session entirely on voluntary donations, and provides hot meals and refreshments every week along with valuable advice and support on different issues, in particular housing, benefits and education.

Freedom Café’s next goal is to be able to help individuals in the later stages of their recovery with Maths and English tuition so that they can get GCSE qualifications and increase job opportunities, help them with job search, build CVs and apply for jobs.

Ultimately, the “Freedom Café” contributes to reducing risks of depression, loneliness and relapses and all the consequent risks.

The Re:Charge R&R staff running the drop in sessions were once receiving support themselves, and have gone on to be trained, mentored and nurtured to gain skills and confidence to help and support our current users. In this way, Re:Charge R&R is growing organically.

However, with the sessions growing and to be able to reach more families in need within the community, we now need to raise £4,500 per month.

We need to strengthen our short and long term funding streams as a matter of urgency, so we would be pleased if you would consider our request at the earliest opportunity.

Any donation would have a huge impact on our users and help them to gain the skills, vision and motivation to change their life.
