Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

Hello! I am back from my sabbatical. And as things here at church have run so well, I am guessing that most people didn't notice my absence from local church things from May to August!

A sabbatical is time to pause, to do something different, to reflect and refresh. I did an online course on biblical counselling, visited a number of other churches and spent time with the ministers, took a trip to a mission partner in Kenya, and grabbed bits of family time too. It was, if anything, slightly too busy, but isn't that the way in this part of the world? It has certainly made me think about **time**.

One thing I haven't enjoyed since moving to the South East, is how busy people can be. We seem to be working too many hours to support too-large mortgages; we can run around too many activities for the kids, committing to too many too-costly lifestyle choices... And we all feel pressured into it, don't we, because everyone else is doing it.

Having taken time off the usual treadmill to reflect, I am keen to cling on to some things I was reminded of to do with time. Time with people with no agenda and nothing to be achieved other than some fun and fellowship is valuable. In Africa, I was at a 6-hour elders' meeting and the church gatherings lasted 4 hours (including various bits). Whilst these cannot be directly transferred here (!?!) it was a huge demonstration of people's commitment to people, not rushing off to the next thing, but spending the **time** then and there. 


A visit to **Saville Gardens in Windsor** is planned for October, at a date to be confirmed. Ring any of the numbers below for confirmation and details.

We've had a wonderful start to the new academic year, with the children returning full of energy and enthusiasm for the exciting months ahead.

We began with our immersion days, introducing each class to their new topics. Foundation children have been exploring *All About Me*, getting to know each other and discovering our school grounds.

Year 1 & 2 have stepped into the world of traditional tales, enjoying stories such as *Jack and the Beanstalk*, *The Princess and the Pea*, and *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*. They had great fun making a beanstalk, creating lollystick characters, and building houses outside.

Year 3 & 4 have begun their topic on the Vikings. They explored Viking life by creating their own shields, learning through *Horrible Histories*, and culminating in a lively battle re-enactment on the school field — complete with shields, helmets, and even a longship built from pallets and planks!

Year 5 & 6 are travelling back to Tudor England with their *Off with their Heads!* topic. They have made Tudor Roses, studied the warring houses, designed their own family coats of arms, and created jewellery fit for a queen — learning about the importance of hierarchy in the Tudor court. Their Tudor learning continued on a residential trip to Hooke Court, where they made candles, cooked Tudor recipes, played traditional games, and even enjoyed a Tudor banquet with dancing. The trip concluded with a 'Time Team' dig, unearthing ancient artefacts.

This autumn term promises more exciting events, including Jeans for Genes Day, a Macmillan Coffee Morning, an RE and Art theme day, and our Harvest Service in church. We are also looking forward to our first PTA event of the year — an outdoor cinema!

Sunny Weather

We're never satisfied with the weather, are we? Last time, I wrote about windy weather so this time it's about sunny weather. What sort of weather do you prefer? Rain, sun, wind, snow? They all have their own 'charms' don't they?



How many of us prefer to take our holidays abroad, where we expect to get guaranteed sun, whereas in England, we usually don't get the consistent sunshine (although this year we have had a much better summer)? I know there's always the danger of sitting outside and getting too much sun. Or when abroad, there can be the possibility of devastating forest fires or a prolonged, serious drought, which can destroy much-needed crops.



As always in our lives, we need a balance of weather so that plants and seeds particularly, are able to get the moisture and warmth to grow fully and mature.

It's therefore not surprising how in some parts of the world the sun came to be worshipped as the bringer, not just of warmth, but of good health and plentiful crops. Do you ever walk in the countryside and see the vast array of crops glistening in the warm sunshine and notice creation's amazing handiwork that enables the food cycle to flourish under the watchful eye of farmers?

The sun also plays a large part in teaching us about life. In the Bible, Jesus frequently used countryside examples to talk to the crowds about the work of farmers by telling little stories or parables. Probably one of the most well-known is the parable of the soil types in Luke chapter 8. Here, the sun is not mentioned at all, but it is presumed to have been a key factor in the germination of the seed. Some of the seed fell on the footpath, some fell on rocky ground, some among weeds and some in good soil. These are mini-pictures of the way that we respond to Jesus. The moisture is mentioned but of course, both water and warmth are needed for all seeds and plants to grow to their best. So, we need to be growing in faith constantly.

Have you ever noticed that when Jesus was crucified, the sun stopped shining for three hours, perhaps in an eclipse (see Luke chapter 23 verse 44)? This was God's way of showing that he allowed Jesus to take our sin on his broken body and that he, our Holy God, could not look on all that evil in the world being placed on his son.



Have you ever thought about how important the sun and the son are in God's world?

My Story (part 3)

Last time, we had joined our ship (RHMS Patris) in Singapore Harbour. Ahead of us was an amazing journey of new things, new places and a real adventure. So much was totally unknown, but the wonderful truth is that our God knew everything that was happening to us and even more important, everything that would occur in the days, weeks and years ahead. As you discover, although so much of this was wonderful, some things happened to us that did not feel wonderful.

We spent 48 hours berthed on Patris, exploring a little of Singapore and doing some shopping. We then cast off for another adventure. None of us had experienced ocean travel before, so it would be a series of surprises.

Fortunately, we never experienced truly rough weather; as we travelled south through Indonesia, we got used to the way of life aboard: delicious food served by crew members we came to know, scenery that varied daily and lovely, warm weather. There was plenty to do on what was technically a cruise, with emigrating passengers like us sharing the journey.

When we lived in Littlehampton, we had got to know lots of people in the church and neighbourhood including two related families to whom we grew very close. The daughter of one family had emigrated to Western Australia, so it was a real joy that she and her Aussie husband were able to meet us when we docked in Fremantle. But time in Western Australia was very short- just a few hours- and then we were back aboard and away.

Now we were travelling mostly eastwards and during the night across the Great Australian Bight – though renowned for being quite rough, for us it was smooth and we arrived in Melbourne the next morning. We took advice and caught the train from the dock to the city centre, where we wandered about an attractive area with our girls, who were then 13 and 6.

From Melbourne we sailed through the Bass Strait and on to Sydney. The harbour is pretty dramatic, and it was a thrill to sail under the Harbour Bridge and see the Opera House close up. We docked and boarded a passenger ferry across the harbour to Taronga Park Zoo, as it was then called. We had a splendid time there, getting acquainted with Australian creatures we were thrilled to see.



When we returned to the boat it was devoid of cruise passengers; as evening came on, dinner was served (great food and lovely service too!) and soon we were heading East on the final leg of our emigration journey.



Tales from the Bells



White Waltham Bell Ringing

In August, our tower had a good clean from top to bottom on the inside. One Sunday afternoon, a team of seven spent about two hours. A couple of the team did the stairs, a couple in the ringing chamber and a three in the Belfry. It made light work of what can take some time to do if there are just 2 people.

Why was this done? I hear you ask. Well, it has been some time since we had the Tower and Belfries Committee from the Oxford Diocesan Guild of Bell Ringers come and do an inspection. So, with the tower nice and clean, I then arranged for an inspection to be carried out.

When the man came to do the inspection, it was very nerve-racking. He made his way up the tower, checking the stairs. They mark on the condition of the stone stairs, making sure none are worn. Some towers can have badly worn steps. Thankfully, ours are in good condition.

They then mark the cleanliness of the Ringing Chamber (which is where we ring the bells from). They check to see if we have a First Aid Kit, a tower maintenance record book; they check the condition of the ropes, the presence of an emergency light, to name but a few items. Then they check the important part; the belfry where the bells are. All six bells are thoroughly checked including the working parts such as pulleys, slider boards, clappers... the lot!!

When he had finished the inspection we were not told the result, as the inspector had to work out the scorings. A few days later, I had an email giving us the result. We have managed to gain a GOLD award.

The good thing with these inspections is that it is like an MOT for the bells. It did highlight a few things. One was that there was some unwanted movement. This has been caused by the hot weather, which dries woodwork up. Straight after the inspection, one of the ringers went up with spanners and tightened all nuts and bolts. All wheels are now ok.

We had a short wait for the new certificate to be sent out – it is now displayed in the ringing chamber. It means that the bells are safe to ring. Also, it's good to have had a clean and tidy up before we had the Heritage Open Day Weekend.
