Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

As I write this, I am planning for my sabbatical which runs from May to August. 'Lucky for him' I hear you mutter, and yes, I feel very blessed to have this opportunity to study something different, to reflect, to travel and see other ministries, and to rest, after 21 years of working fulltime for the church in various capacities.

But let's think about 'rest'.

Research rather obviously shows us that it is good for us to rest. Stress and illness can come from not taking enough rest. That taking occasional 'duvet days' in whatever shape that comes can increase overall productivity; taking a break for something fun amongst revision, stepping away from the computer out into the sunshine for lunch. Working the hours you are supposed to and then stopping...

You will know from experience the benefit of a reset, to get away, do something different for a change, the mindfulness craze.

Did you know our Father God made us for 'rest'?

God modelled it in creation, when he had finished creating, he 'rested'. He paused, experienced, enjoyed. He gave us the model of a seven-day week, with one day for 'rest'. Our Western society is not any better, healthier or happier for losing the distinction of a day of the week without work, without shopping, but for pause, experience, enjoy.

The bible (and the news!) records humanity rejecting God, working for their own glory, leading to growing competition, fear, uncertainty about the future, brittle pride and jealousy.

But then Jesus came to restore us and give us rest.

He said "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11).

Sounds wonderful, doesn't it? At Easter, we see how that can be.

As we see the cross of Good Friday clearly, we see that it:

- † takes us down, it humbles us; we need a rescue and a sacrifice of epic proportions! The Son of God had to die to pay our debt!
- † takes us up, it values us; God loves us this much, the value of his only begotten beloved Son!

And if we can see how we are humbled beyond any self-help, pride or competition, and raised up beyond any fear, jealousy and uncertainty, **then** we are freed for rest. We are all in the same situation, needing the same rescue from the same saviour, and freed to follow the same Lord whose yoke is easy, whose burden is light, and so who brings us rest.

I urge you to consider the cross of Good Friday. As we respond to what Jesus has done for those who trust in Him, we are truly freed to pause, experience and enjoy, all that our loving Father God is and has for us, now and forever.

Our services every Sunday at 10.30 are a good place to start your exploration of this alongside many others who have found what it is to follow this Jesus and be released from so much!



White Waltham C of E Academy



It has been a jam-packed summer term with lots of exciting learning and experiences for all the children at White Waltham. We celebrated the 80th anniversary of VE Day in May with a mini street party on the field. The school was decorated with bunting, and we all enjoyed dressing in red, white, and blue. Below are some of the highlights from the rest of the term.

Foundation Stage

Foundation have been very busy this term, learning all about plants and growing through their Extraordinary Garden topic. They learned about the different parts of a plant and set up their own garden centre in the role play area to buy and sell seeds and plants. The children also planted their own tomato plants and watched as the tomatoes developed and ripened.

Foundation also enjoyed a visit to Wisley Gardens, where they explored the Vegetable Garden to discover edible plant parts and learnt where food comes from and how it is grown.

Year 1 and 2

Year 1 and 2 have thoroughly enjoyed their topic, *Our Wonderful World*. In this environmentally themed unit, they learned about the famous broadcaster and natural historian Sir David Attenborough (who turned 99 this year!). The children explored the countries he has visited, located Madagascar on a world map, and investigated the African climate and animal adaptations. They carried out fieldwork on the school grounds to discover an array of minibeasts, completed observational drawings, and created collages inspired by Eric Carle, author of *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. To enhance their learning, the children visited Beale Park to find out more about African animals and their habitats.

Year 3 and 4

This term, Year 3 and 4 have explored the topic *Marvellous Monarchs*. They looked back almost 1,000 years to 1066, when William the Conqueror became king after the Battle of Hastings. They learned how the role of the monarchy has changed over time, including the



significance of the Magna Carta. A visit to Warwick Castle brought their learning to life, with the Birds of Prey talk being a particular highlight!

In Geography, they studied the United Kingdom, learning about its four countries, capital cities, landmarks, and climate variations. Finally, through a cross-curricular DT and Music project, they created eco-friendly

musical instruments from recyclable materials as part of their work on caring for the environment.

Year 5 and 6

Year 5 and 6 were inspired by their topic *Global Warming*. They explored the causes and effects of climate change, using maps and data to investigate the most affected areas. In DT, the children studied flooding in Bangladesh and designed sustainable floating garden prototypes to help grow crops in flooded areas. They also learned about King Charles III and his environmental efforts, including the Terra Carta initiative. The children visited Bushy Park for a workshop run by the Field Studies Council to deepen their understanding of nature and sustainability.

To end the year, we enjoyed a fantastic production of *The Lion King*. Year 6 took part in a workshop led by West End actors and attended a matinee performance of the show. They learned a range of new skills that helped them shine in their own performance. The children were also involved in creating props and set design. The whole production was a wonderful finale to the 2024–25 academic year, and Year 6 did a brilliant job leading it. We hope it becomes a cherished memory of their final days at primary school



TREK

We love walking in the countryside, spotting wildlife in an observant way, visiting places of historical interest, embracing local foods and cultures and, of course, meeting new people from varied backgrounds. My wife won a Telegraph writing competition which offered a holiday discount, so from the list of trips offered, we chose a holiday to Carcassonne, in southern France, where the focus was on wildlife – birds, butterflies flowers – designed for a group with a strong interest in these things.

We packed our bags, including binoculars and cameras, and the itinerary for the week. We flew to southern France and met up with the group of charming friendly people from all walks of life who made us feel very welcome. We discovered that four had links with Maidenhead and some lived in places we had visited. We had a lovely variety of social workers, a male Nurse, a languages teacher, a horticulturist, a retired oil executive, a retired couple and a Professor! A great group to get to know.

We visited the Cathar castles of Queribus and Carcassonne which were excellent and another one in the small village of Villerouge, which has been beautifully restored inside and out to make a delightful historical and educational tour. The funding for this came from the village council as they recognised it as a local and regional amenity.

Amongst the plentiful vineyards of the scrubland – the garrigue – we had our picnic lunch each day, sitting at rustic tables consuming the food and wine provided by our





guides. During each day out, everyone tried to identify for example, the red-footed

falcon, the mazarine blue butterfly, the lady orchid or whatever the species were. All the group had an enormous knowledge, except us, not just of identification but of the intricacies of each subject's uniqueness. They were all totally committed to their wildlife craft.

It was a wonderful insight into God's intricate world of nature, and there is still more awaiting discovery for us all. But it also made me think. Here were fourteen people who were so committed to their hobby and their respectful belief in the magnificence of wildlife, that it was the basis of their life-style.

For me it questioned my commitments and yours. We all have areas of life which are of vital importance to us, just like our new friends. We loved the opportunity of meeting new people and showing our commitment to our church, our faith and to God's wonderful world.

So why not come and join our trek.... Just as we left our comfort zone, come on Sunday to find out more!

Mhite Waltham Bell Ringing

Recently, the Sonning Deanery Branch Striking Competition was hosted by White Waltham. There were six teams that took part, Arborfield, Easthampstead, Sonning, White Waltham, Wokingham All Saints and the Branch Youth Team.

The team that won was Easthampstead with only 24 faults, followed by Wokingham, All Saints with 26 faults, then Arborfield with 35 faults. In fourth place was Sonning with 42 faults. And just three faults behind Sonning was White Waltham with 45 faults. The Youth Team had 53 faults. Our youngest learner rang in his first contest and was in the Youth Team. It is hoped that next year he will be ringing with the rest of the White Waltham band.

We improved our striking from last year when it was held at Shottesbrooke, where we had 117 faults, so we really improved. Of course, we did have a home advantage as they were bells that we are used to and had practised a lot the night before the competition. I carefully thought about which ringer would ring which bell and placed a more experienced ringer each side of a slightly less experienced ringer. Although we did not win, it was a very positive result with fewer faults and the comments from the judges were a good reflection of how we sounded. In general, the standard of the striking by all teams was really good. Easthampstead will go on to represent the Sonning Branch at the Guild six bell striking competition. We wish them luck.

Our thanks go to one of our non-ringing church members for helping out on the day (I was really nervous!). And thanks to our team members for helping with the food. As usual the Ringers' Tea was ladened with sandwiches and cake – I'm sure it was enjoyed by all.

On Thursday 8 May we rang for the 80th Celebration of VE Day.



My Story (part 1)

Sometimes I wonder what topic I should write about and then I pray for guidance. Last night in bed, I was doing just that and it occurred to me that it is such a long time since I lived in Woodlands Park, that many readers will have no idea who I am and why I contribute to the Parish Magazine. Then I thought perhaps some would be interested in my story - so here goes!

When World War II started, I was just a babe in my Mum's womb emerging into the light in Spring 1940 (now you know how old I am!). From a very young age I was taken to church with my Mum and Dad who were very keen Christians.

My brother was born in 1944 but before that, I had heard bombs exploding not far from where we lived and realised that my dad, who worked as a civilian for the RAF was a Fire Warden which, much late I realised was a dangerous extra job to have. I spent some time away from London in Stafford to get my pregnant Mum and me away to relative safety.

So, I grew up learning about the Christian faith, war and a new baby. By the age of 5 I started Primary School, a Church School in the south London suburb of Sydenham.

Just a year later, we had a visiting preacher come to our church and as a result, at the tender age of 6, I accepted the Lord Jesus as my personal Saviour. Of course, that was just a beginning as I had (and still have!) much to learn about what being a Christian means.

I took the Eleven Plus and moved on to Alleyn's in Dulwich. I learned a lot, was a cadet in the Combined Cadet Force (later made it to L/Cpl) and had the cane (yes boys were caned in those days!) twice. Once was for coming on parade in mufti when I should have been in uniform and the other time in woodwork when a picture frame I had "made" fell to bits when the master picked it up; being caned left lasting impressions long after the bruises had disappeared.

I played three different sports: cricket, football and Rugby Fives, at which I was in a school team. This sport is not well known: it is played in a closed court similar to Squash, but instead of a racquet, player use gloved hands.

I left school at Easter aged just 18 to start work with the Royal Insurance in the city. Later, I moved to the Prudential and then to Sun Alliance and it was there that I switched from clerical work to what we then called EDP. Today it is I.T.!

Quite soon after leaving school, my girlfriend and I got married much earlier than planned, because we had broken God's rules and our first child was born not long afterwards. But God was so good. Through the sacrifice of His son, Jesus Christ at Calvary, He forgave our sin and helped us to bring up our little girl (now a retired lady!) to also love and trust Him.

One other thing occurred in my teens; at 14 I asked to be baptised and the church where the family worshipped baptised me in the Biblical way by immersion.

And then there were twelve...

'As Jesus was walking beside the sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me" Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men" At once they left their nets and followed him.

(Matthew 5:18)

They trusted Jesus and stopped their work to join him. He comes across two other brothers James and John who were working in a boat with their father Zebedee. Each of these men left everything to devote themselves to sharing in Jesus' work (how Zebedee felt we are not told!). An encounter had become a commitment.

The key point of this account lies in Jesus' remark "I will make you fishers of men". It leads us on to the 'The Great Commission' that we read of in the final passage of Matthew's gospel. Such forms the core of the early church. It is a commitment to make disciples of all nations — to make known the Gospel message.

The same message is vital and relevant today – it might be considered the most significant of the church's work. Now, as in New Testament times, there is fierce and violent opposition to the church in many places. We read of the necessity of Joseph having to take Mary and Jesus to seek safety in Egypt. Now, the church remains threatened – the urgency for passing on the Gospel message – Jesus' appeal for peace is great.

Parking in Maidenhead

As part of ongoing efforts to improve parking in Maidenhead, the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM) introduced a new **temporary car park** in December, conveniently located behind **Nicholsons Shopping Centre**. This new facility replaces the Broadway multistorey car park, which was recently



demolished due to safety concerns. Operated by **Green Parking**, the car park provides **100 surface-level spaces**, making it easier for shoppers and visitors to access the high street and local businesses.

If you'd like to save money and don't mind a 10-minute walk into the town centre, the new Vicus Way car park at Stafferton Way is affordable and always has spaces available, also including plenty of Electric Vehicle chargers. Three hours parking for £3 is at least £1.50 cheaper than any town centre car park, with all-day long-stay parking just £6. Also, at Vicus Way car park you can park at the weekend from 4pm on a Friday to 11pm on a Monday for £10 which is ideal if you have a planned visit for a weekend and take the train.



Shottesbrooke and White Waltham Welfare Fund

A letter of support will be required from a Social Worker, a Vicar/Priest, a Head Teacher, or another official body.


Want some financial help with your education?


