

The Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends of the Parish of White Waltham and Woodlands Park,

Can you see **Chaos** around you? **Chaos** in the world? As I write on American election day (and bonfire night), I can only speculate what is about to happen in that country... I can only pray for a humble acceptance of the result and a peaceful going about business. [stop-press: the result is in as I write, and so far, it looks ok...] Certainly, the war in Ukraine shows little sign of ending; tensions and tit-for-tat attacks in the middle East seem to be increasing; and other areas struggle with floods, famine and disease.

Nearer to home, **chaos** might look like the latest budget, raising costs and endangering some of the vulnerable, as we seek to balance the books after years of living beyond our means.

In our lives, **chaos** might mean relational problems, financial difficulties, injury or illness, loss and other events out of our control.

Why dwell on this in a dark month? Because the Christian faith offers control in the chaos, hope beyond the overwhelming events.

We have recently seen this at church as we have looked at the bible accounts of the life of Joseph: lots of people making mistakes, behaving badly, and yet God acting to save people through bringing Joseph to the right place and giving him the ability to decode prophetic dreams.

And we will be seeing this as we look at Matthew's genealogy of Jesus. This includes some famous heroes like Abraham and King David, but also foreigners such as Ruth, prostitutes such as Rahab, children born from affairs such as Solomon, and from tawdry family affairs such as Perez. Again and again, through international chaos, family rivalry, the selfishness and lusts of human beings, God brings about his purposes: his purposes to save and to bless.

Of course, **Jesus is the ultimate example of this**. From his birth to unmarried parents of an oppressed ethnicity in a Roman colony, through to his unjust trial and torture and execution, it all looked like chaos. But God was working to save people and to bless.

Friends, we all suffer from chaos; we know suffering and injustice and days that seem overwhelming. Jesus offers a way through. He calmed chaotic hurricanes, healed illness and raised the dead, showing himself to be the one place for true hope.

The Christian Hope is something we will explore in a short course in the New Year, and it would be lovely if you wanted to join us and bring your questions and chaos! You will find details on page 12 – you are welcome to just try the first session. Join on Zoom, or let me know a different day/time that works for you.

You are also always very welcome to join us at any service on a Sunday at 10.30. We all know some chaos, we all need hope; we can help each other discover more of the hope our loving Father God provides. He is in control and will always be there for you, if you let him.

White Waltham CE Academy



It has been a wonderful autumn term for all the children and teachers at White Waltham CE Academy. We have lots to celebrate from the children's hard work across the term.

We are all extremely proud of how well our EYFS children settled into school life. They have been busy getting to know their new friends, as well as their teachers and other staff around the school.

The children enjoyed looking back at pictures of themselves as babies and discussing all the ways that they have changed since then.

The children were very excited to venture outside the school grounds for the first time to go on a walk around the village. They practised following a simple map to find some important local buildings and places and then made their own maps back at school. The children have begun their Bikeability lessons, learning how to ride balance bikes safely on the playground: lots of happy, smiley faces during those lessons.

Year 1 and 2 have been engrossed in their topic of 'Land Ahoy'. During this topic, the children have been looking at the history of the British seaside. They have written information texts on the things you would pack for a trip to the seaside and made a sandwich in DT to take in their picnic.

After half-term, the children learnt how to play a sea shanty using the recorder and in computing, they designed a program using basic algorithms on 'Scratch'. The children had a fantastic workshop with 'History Off the Page' where they had a seaside experience in our school hall. The workshop concluded with a brilliant Punch and Judy puppet show.

Year 3 and 4 have been studying 'Beneath the Surface'. They studied the destruction in Pompeii and the impact this had on the way of living. They studied volcanoes and mountains in geography and enjoyed a trip to the Verulamium in St Albans to enrich their topic on the Romans. In DT, the children made a healthy Italian salad and in music they created a soundscape to a volcanic eruption.



Year 5 and 6's 'World at War' topic started with an exciting visit to Hooke Court. During this visit, the children were able to immerse themselves in an interactive trench experience. They also recreated battle simulations in WW1 and WW2 to understand the developments in warfare. They then became evacuees, studying in a wartime classroom and cracking codes.

The children enjoyed a trip to the birthplace of Winston Churchill, Blenheim Palace, later in the term.

All children took part in an RE and Art day, where they discussed the creation story. They each created a piece of artwork which is now hung in pride of place outside our school office for everyone to enjoy.

Window on the World

What do you think about, when you hear that expression? It came into my mind the other day, as I was repairing an upstairs window frame that had rotted away. I was high up and I could see White Waltham village and all the interesting activity around!

What "windows on the world" have stuck in your mind and affected you personally, recently? We've had some "windows on the world" recently: the trick or treat of children scurrying around the houses collecting goodies; the latest financial Government decisions with expectations of success; the devastating, ravaging floods in parts of Europe with tragic loss of life; the dismissal of the Man United manager, along with the appointment of a new manager. There are so many "windows on the world" that you and I, in our elevated position of easy access to the news, can experience very quickly.

It was not like this 2000 years ago. No news broadcasts, only word of mouth; no social media where one could pass on the latest information by a quick text. There was no less scepticism then about events of the day.

I refer, of course, to the "window on the world" of that first 'Christmas day'. Mary and Joseph knew that they had to go for the census to Bethlehem, but why that week, they must have thought, with Mary heavily pregnant? The distance, the accommodation, the crowded streets, the surprising revelations. But what about the hard-working shepherds – why them? Just shepherds, maybe representing the working-class people of the day. The biggest window on the world of their lives? Angels no less, telling them where to go and exactly what to find, as they left the middle of the Bethlehem countryside, as instructed – and finding a special baby, not in a palace but in a stable! Mind-blowing for them in their window!

A little later the Wise Men came. Maybe the clever people of society; certainly, they had studied the stars and knew about prophecies. Perhaps the revelation for them was a little less unexpected. It was their window on the world and confirmation of all their studies and expectations, since they came prepared – carrying three gifts. They came looking for a Messiah, a Saviour, and found that this baby fulfilled their window on the world.

Joseph and Mary's joy at their window on the world must have turned to fear and anxiety as they were told by an angel to flee to Egypt. They became refugees for a while, experiencing what many people today see from their window on the world.

God, through his window on the world, looked after them and can look after us too.

Read Luke chapter 2 and Matthew chapter 2 to learn more about Jesus, this Christmas. Look through your window on the world and discover that Jesus is our Saviour.



Christmas is coming

It is quite funny (peculiar I mean) just how quite suddenly, it is almost Christmas. And as you read this, it will be so much closer too!

Now I know that just about everybody understands that Christmas is a really happy occasion and a tremendous reason for celebrating. Don't get me wrong, I expect to be very happy this coming Christmas too, but I will also have many conflicting and even sad feelings.

Do you need qualifications to celebrate? If so, what are they? After all, people in just about every country in the world, every religion and even those with no religious 'feelings' at all will celebrate. So, what is Christmas all about?

The first reason I have some sad feelings at this time of year is because I realise that the majority of people in our world simply do not know why we even have Christmas. 

Here in our Borough, we are so appreciative to have 82/83% Green Belt. This summer gave us the lush vegetation, trees in full bloom and the wonderful green fields. November is upon us, and we have the fantastic array of autumnal beauty, as the trees gently change the colour of their leaves in readiness for winter. In all seasons, there is so much for us to appreciate in our beautiful Borough.

We've had Halloween and November 5th with fun for all ages. Now, we are getting ready for Christmas – a huge event for most. Shortly, there will be Christmas trees decorated, lights on houses and in gardens, the question of what to buy for presents and, of course, our young children proudly inviting parents and family to their Nativity play – to show us the meaning of Christmas.

In the council, we had a new CEO and Finance Officer at the start of the new administration – the new administration is the party that was elected at the 2023 election. These officers are working with the administration at a transformation of the council and so much work has gone into this to ensure all the departments are running smoothly and give the greatest benefit for our residents. However, we have Overview and Scrutiny Panels that scrutinise what is going on in the council and can investigate in depth concerns raised. So, very little just goes through without this extra vigilance.

You may have heard of the pressures the council have been having with the huge rise in costs for Adults and Children's Services, especially in Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) We are not alone in this as most councils across the country are experiencing similar high rises in these services.



Support for borough households struggling with cost of essentials this winter Following the extension of the government's Household Support Fund, the next round of help for residents struggling with essential costs this winter has been launched Royal Borough of Windsor Maidenhead. bv the & As in previous rounds, the latest £587,000 funding pot will be used to provide one-off payments of £150, to help with the cost of essentials and bills, and free school meal vouchers, for those struggling to provide food for their children during the school holidays. The Household Support Fund is just one way that residents can access help in the Royal Borough – from assistance with childcare costs and council tax, access to food banks and help for mental and physical wellbeing, to money management skills and debt advice, further support is available. Alexander Devine Children's Hospice

For those who are not aware of this fantastic Children's Hospice, it is in Woodlands Park, Maidenhead. The charity is in the hands of Fiona Devine, a mother who lost her 8-year-old son to cancer. She has worked and continues to work tirelessly in the Hospice that is only there because of her. The Hospice is for children with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions and is the only Children's Hospice between London and Oxford. It also supports the families. Here's a little bit of information (you may like to join them for the Santa Run in December or for the Camino de Santiago trek next year).



Just 17% of the Hospice's income comes from government funding; they are nearly entirely reliant on the support of our local community for donations, fundraising, and gifts in Wills to help fund this vital service. There are many ways you could give support:
