Looking forward, we are trying to grow relationships more, and we are trying to find out what sort of further loving service would be useful to our communities. With this in mind, we are relaunching our **toddler group** (*see page 9*). We also hope to run our **Holiday Club** for primary school children again on the mornings of Wednesday 1st to Friday 3rd April (*see page 6* – do save the dates), and we wonder about the possible usefulness of some sort of course or meetings to help with **managing money and budgeting**; or maybe training to do with other bits of **family life, parenting**; or starting a **bereavement group**. If you have any ideas, or would be interested in any of these, please do be in touch – we would love to have your feedback and involvement.

This desire to love our neighbour comes from the Lord Jesus who we follow, and who came for everyone. The simple nativity story includes the range of humanity; poor (smelly) shepherds, the visiting foreign wise men and an unmarried couple settling down amongst animals with a newborn baby.

And this theme grows through further Jesus stories. You have probably heard of the traitor taxman, Zacchaeus, who climbs down from his hiding place in a tree to be welcomed into friendship with Jesus; or the foreign-enemy and disreputable Samaritan woman who Jesus spends time with; and all the other marginalised, ill, crippled, young, and socially disadvantaged people that Jesus loves.

This message of Jesus coming for all has never been so counter-cultural – or so desperately needed. Jesus, God’s Son on earth, came to ‘seek and save the lost’; came ‘not to be served but to serve’; came not to pursue his own glory and use his awesome power for his own benefit, but to live and die as sacrifice for others. Jesus is the Saviour and Lord we follow, and so we ask God’s help to live lives of similar loving service.

We finish our series on the **Good News of Jesus** in February (*see page 11*) where we have invited questions and discussion as we all seek to grow in our understanding of God and what difference it makes to live for Jesus. We welcome questions, challenges and debates at any time because faith in Jesus has to make a difference at work, at home, and in all parts of life. I pray you will know the blessing of the love of God in Jesus.

The children enjoyed the snow in the playground, and it was a special moment to see the joy experienced by the children having some wintery fun, despite the cold fingers and toes!



At the end of the Autumn Term, we celebrated Christmas with our Early Years and Key Stage 1 Nativity Performances. 



Remove and Make Good

‘Remove and make good’ is often the instruction included in the specification given to the builder before he commences working on an older structure. Ancient, perished brickwork will need to be dismantled and disposed of before any new bricks are laid. Similarly, in our lives, old habits, old ways, may need to be cast off and forgotten if we are to make a fresh beginning – one acceptable to God.

‘Repentance’ is a word we often hear – ‘repent and be saved’. Salvation might be considered as being synonymous with rescue – comparable with being pulled safely onto a boat in order to avoid drowning, which is what the disciples feared when their frail craft on the Sea of Galilee became swamped by the waves. We can imagine the sheer terror. Their appeal to Jesus, who lay sleeping in the stern of the boat, didn’t go unheeded. They awoke him “Master, don’t you care if we drown? To their utter amazement, he stood up and rebuked the tempest, which immediately became subdued. “Why are you so afraid?” He said, “Have you no faith?”

Salvation had come to the disciples, but they remained terrified. “What kind of man is this that even the wind and waves obey him?” Such a rescue can come to any of us if we are able to overcome fear and replace it with trust, thereby putting our life – our destiny – in His hands.

White Waltham C of E Academy



We have had a wonderful start to 2026 here at White Waltham C of E Academy. The children returned after their Christmas break eager and ready to learn, and we began the term with immersion days for our new spring term topics.

Foundation enjoyed learning about the countries of India and China. They made comparisons between life in these countries and their own, linking their learning to stories and other resources shared in class. The children learnt about cultural traditions and celebrations from both countries and explored similarities and differences between the past and present by investigating how transport has changed over time. This helped them understand how people are now able to travel around the world. They also learnt about the famous Wright brothers and their first aeroplane flight in 1903.

Year 1 and 2 had a very exciting start to the term learning about *The Frozen Kingdom*. The children learnt about Inuit history and culture, discovering how Inuit people lived in small groups and depended on hunting, fishing and gathering for survival. They explored how the Inuit adapted to the challenges of the Arctic environment including limited vegetation, snow and ice, and long periods of darkness during winter. They also learnt how the land and animals provided everything needed to survive such as food, fuel, and materials for clothing, shelter, tools and utensils. The children investigated Inuit technologies including igloos, kayaks, ulus (women's knives), quilliqs (small stone stoves used as a source of heat and light), fur clothing and toggle-head harpoons. They considered how Inuit communities were extremely resourceful and self-sufficient, making the most of what the land had to offer.

Year 3 and 4 began their topic on Africa. In history, the children learnt about the Kingdom of Benin, which was located in modern-day Nigeria. They explored key features of the kingdom, including the role of the Oba (monarch), and learnt how Benin became an important trading nation, due to the exceptional craft skills of its people. In geography, the children studied the continent of Africa using maps, atlases and globes to locate and label the continent and its largest countries. They learnt that Africa is a vast continent with a wide range of climate zones and biomes, including rainforests and deserts, and explored a variety of African cultural traditions.



Year 5 and 6 are learning all about *Shackleton's Journey*. In history, the children learnt about the famous explorer and sailor, Sir Ernest Shackleton, and the early 20th-century race to reach the South Pole. They discovered



how, in 1911, Shackleton set out on his expedition alongside Captain Scott, aiming to be the first to reach the South Pole. The children explored the many challenges faced by the expedition team including extreme cold, dangerous conditions and rivalry with fellow explorer, Roald Amundsen. In geography, the

children learnt to locate and label Antarctica, the Arctic Ocean, surrounding seas and countries using atlases. They compared the climate zones of Antarctica, the Arctic tundra and the UK, and studied human and physical features such as permafrost, glaciers, Mount Vinson, research stations and Inuit settlements. They also explored extreme weather conditions and used computer technology to plot and interpret data through graphs.



Back home, Hannah had a son, and she named him Samuel.





To believe – there was still room.


Their Star-led trip, for these men wise,



My Story (part 5)

I want to show just how events in our lives often attain far more importance than we realised at the time. A few years after the end of WW2, a friend of my family in London received a visit from a man named Colin. Colin was a merchant seaman who had served in the New Zealand Navy. Some years later, he retired from the sea and lived with his wife and his mother in Mount Maunganui, a beautiful place on NZ's east coast. When we arrived in NZ, one weekend I drove my wife Sylvia and our two daughters to "The Mount" for a glorious weekend with Colin and his family. We knew no one else in New Zealand, but God had it all in His plan for us and the family visited us several times – we had friends in NZ already!

When we emigrated, I had transported my car which arrived in Auckland a few days after we did. I was thrilled to get my lovely Singer Gazelle back and drove to and from work in it. Not long after, I was shunted by a bus pulling away from its stop as I slowed for a zebra crossing. Thank goodness for Motor Insurance and God's protection as I was not injured.

Work started to take shape. As an IT consultant in the field of Life Assurance, I was assigned to a Government Department with Headquarters in New Zealand's capital city, Wellington, at the southern tip of North Island. Although we had settled into life in Auckland, after some six months of work in our Office, I had to fly to Wellington every week. Again, God was taking care of us in lots of ways. At weekends, we enjoyed warm Christian fellowship at a church close to where we lived, and I found the same loving fellowship at a Wellington church during the week.

In NZ we have a Government Department called the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC) which, as its name implies, aims to pay the costs of accidents to those involved. Its first day of operation was April 1 1974 and, yes, you've guessed it! As a couple of colleagues and I were walking along the Wellington waterfront from our office to our hotel, I tried to jump over a low fence, skidded on some gravel and fell, breaking my leg. So, I was one of ACC's first customers! Wellington Hospital fixed my leg and it healed nicely. I was in God's care every second of the time.d

In England or in New Zealand, or wherever you are, do you know the wonder of His care? If you have asked God's Son to be your Saviour, you'll know this and so much more. I was in my mid 30's for the events I have described and now, many years later, I know where I will spend eternity; I know my sins are forgiven and I shall be re-united with my family and hundreds of friends. Do you have this certainty? If not, pray! Admit your need and ask God's Son, Jesus Christ into your life right now. Then you will have a certain future in time and eternity. Don't put it off.

A letter of support will be required from a Social Worker, a Vicar/Priest, a Head Teacher, or another official body.


Want some financial help with your education?


